- Debra
 - Considering Aylard Farms for school beach day in June
 - No date yet
 - Will need to get a permit so will choose a date in January
 - Hoping a smaller beach will work better for the students as well as having access to the field area for games etc.
 - Outdoor classroom
 - Concerns brought about fall protection
 - They will be limiting the number of kids and use it like a quiet place to play and learn
 - Trying to limit play on them because they aren't really meant to be used for jumping
 - Playground
 - Suggested by the Superintendent to speak with the principal at Poirier to see what kind of play structure they have
 - Should look for something smaller
 - Stinson said they might be building a new one playground when they build a new school
 - PAC concerns about spending a lot of money on a play space that might be torn down in the near future – Stinson suggested we look into something that will be easy to move
 - Government paid playground will come with the new school
 - PAC notes Gyro park as a great example of smaller play space that has something for every kid to enjoy
 - Action: Meghan will continue research into play areas and come up with some ideas about what we can do in the small play area.

- o Communicating student learning Celebration of Learning November 21st
 - Some teachers will be doing a regular report card and some will be using the new portal for reporting
 - 3 drop in times for the learning day
 - 12-1pm, 1-2 break, 2-5 open, 5-6 break, 6-7 open but Deb will confirm this with the PAC
 - Open house style
 - Leaving it up to the teacher to contact student's parents who they feel could use a sit down chat but the event won't be focused on individual students – parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher to set up an appointment if they feel they need to
 - It will be more informal rather than sit down meetings
- A request will be put in for upgrades to the back parking lot which is already starting to see potholes forming
 - School is getting a new flagpole
- Floor decals the school does have another set of decals however they aren't as attractive as the other ones by the gym
 - Deb's niece designed one for her school so we will see if she would be willing to design and sell us one that's similar
 - aboriginal themed that uses both the floors and walls interactive
 - we will look at ordering something more elaborate that fits with the primary area of the school
- o thoughts about updating the paint outside on the ground for the kids
 - labyrinth/maze idea
 - very expensive to do
 - something that we can explore

Old Business

- Track and Field Ribbons
 - Having them for our own students
 - o PAC can supply ribbons for our own kids for events at our school
 - o Thoughts about having track and field lines painted on the field for the kids to practice on
 - Sand toys we asked for some donations from parents but the kids seem happy with what they have
 - Will post more on social media for donations
- First aid course for teachers
 - o District already provides it if teachers want to have it and all EAs have it already
 - No interest by the teachers to have it
 - MOTION: To remove providing first aid to the teachers that want to take it from our agenda (JH 1st, MR 2nd CARRIED)
 - Majority voted to remove approved
- Lifeguards for whole school beach day in June
 - o 1 per 100 students, need 3 at least
 - Debra is okay with this
 - MOTION: to use Emergency Medical Responders rather than paid lifeguards at the beach day in June (HG 1st, BH 2nd CARRIED)
- Garden update/Donations
 - o Brittany's donor is going to provide us with safe seeds, soil etc.
 - He's going to reach out to other companies to provide what they can
 - Noted he can get a tax receipt from the school for his donation per Deb
 - o ACTION: Do up a thank you when it's done in the spring
- Created by Kid's & Purdy's Fundraisers
 - o ACTION: We need figure out volunteers to sort items when they come in
 - Created by Kids
 - Some of the forms aren't filled out properly but we are going to send in what we have
 - Issues with payments from parents and forms being incomplete

- Deb will send out an announcement for teachers to bring any forms in by Nov 6th as they will be picked up on Nov 7th
- Probably will be here the 2nd week of December
- o Purdy's
 - School will receive 25% of the money coming in
 - Extra books are being sent to top off Ms. Toderoffs class, a few for the staff room as well
 - ACTION: when the books come in Brittany will make sure to get them to Ms. Toderoff and will
 put extras in the staff room
 - We just need a link to order, books aren't necessary
 - Starting everything on November 12th, cut off is November 26th
 - Brittany will shut down the campaign while she is away
 - Orders coming in the week of December 2nd
 - Goes home on the 6th
 - Online only orders, no cash but we will work it out if needed
- Christmas Movie Update November 28
 - o Popcorn, candy bags, candy canes concession
 - Majority vote passed to not offer hot chocolate this year as it is too messy
 - Starts at 6pm, doors at 5:30
 - Concession closed at 6pm
 - o Intermission we will do a game to get them moving and reopen the concession
 - Heather has offered to have a Santa come to the event will be discussed further by executive (discussion to keep the event quiet)
 - o ACTION: Exec will discuss having Santa at the movie night or if we can utilize this at another date
- Kids Christmas Market
 - Discussion regarding how the sale will be done
 - o The event logistics hasn't been fully decided yet as we need to see how many donated item's we get
 - Suggestion to have parents fill in a shopping list for their children to use to shop for items for their families
 - Volunteers will help the kids find items on their list
 - Concerns that we might not get enough donated items to do this as we want to make sure that every child gets a gift to give whether they have money or not
 - Read through the newsletter to be sent to parents
 - Agree to call it a Kid's Christmas Market
 - Agree no stuffed animals may save this for donations for prizes during spring fair?
 - ACTION: Marianne and Meghan will be planning the event and will make a determination on how the event will be run depending on donations, etc.

Treasurer Report

- We finally received our gaming grant \$6400
 - Less than last year

New Business

- Water testing
 - Everything is good per Deb
 - o There are no concerns about the water quality in our drinking water at the school
 - o NOTE: the new fountains do not have filters as they were too expensive to purchase and maintain
- Hot Lunch November 15th
 - The theme for the day is jersey day
 - ACTION: Will put this on the PAC board and Facebook
 - Ticket idea from Brittany
 - Voted on using tickets for kids getting 2 hotdogs so that we know that they are not getting a regular meal
 - Everyone else entering will just get a meal

- Must ensure that students pay for their lunch before they enter the gym
- We will work out the bugs from the last hot lunch
- Book Fair Info
 - o Received a volunteer sheet from Ms. Smyth
 - It isn't quite the same as last year
 - ACTION: Meghan will confirm with Ms. Smyth about what times she is running the book fair so the volunteer sheet can be revised and posted
 - o ACTION: Meghan will also confirm if Ms. Smyth is having teachers assist in set up or if she needs volunteers for that (PAC members helped set up last year)
- Community Christmas Craft Sale
 - o Received a phone call the other day asking if we are doing a Christmas Market at the school
 - It would be a great opportunity to bring in some easy money for the PAC however the logistics of it will be hard to pull off in less than a month
 - We are staring the planning early in the year next year, September, and will run a craft market next school year
- Bursary Information
 - o MOTION: to change the amount of time for recipient to collect from 18 months to 12 months
